Friday, Day 8

Whitehorse to Dawson

Departure: 07:00 a.m. (Check in: 06:50 a.m.)

Arrival: 01:30 p.m.

Travel historic Klondike Highway between the Yukon capital of Whitehorse and historic gold rush community of Dawson City. This scenic trip offers views of the Tintina Trench (geological fault) which extends from the Northern Rocky Mountain Trench in British Columbia. View celebrated Five Finger Rapids and many spectacular lakes. Visit Braeburn Lodge for internationally famous giant cinnamon buns. Watch for moose, black bear, elk, caribou, fox and raven as you travel. Service is usually provided in a 15-passenger van with luggage trailer.

Saturday, Day 9

Gold Field and Mine tour

See a gold mining operation starting with a trip into the traditional goldfields of the Klondike. The staging area is at the former town site of Gold Bottom, a once thriving, sociable community that boasted a population of close to 5000 people during the hey-days of the 1898 Klondike Gold Rush.

You will be escorted by a member of a family from the authentic gold mining operation on Gold Bottom or Hunker Creek in the Heart of the Klondike! You will receive explanations and demonstrations of historic and modern placer gold mining methods and processes, everything from staking a claim to selling the gold. Enjoy hearing about personal experiences and stories about life on the creeks.

Sunday, Day 10

Dawson to Fairbanks

Departure: 9:00 am

Arrival: 9:00 p.m.

Travel the Alaska and Taylor Highways with majestic views of Alaska and Wrangell-St Elias mountains, Alaska oil pipeline at Big Delta where it is suspended over the Tanana River. Travel along Jack Wade Creek through 40-Mile Gold Mining District in the heart of interior Alaska. Rest stops in rural towns of Delta Junction at a country grocery store with Russian influenced bakery. In Tok, AK visit the beautiful log and most complete visitor center in Alaska. Stop for a meal break in the active gold mining town of Chicken AK, population 39. Watch for black bear, caribou, fox and moose.

While traveling along the Top-of-the-World Highway above tree line most of the way, there are beautiful views of the Ogilvie Mountain Range. Cross the mighty Yukon River on the George Black Ferry. Watch for grizzly (brown) bear and caribou. Service is usually provided in a 15-passenger van with luggage trailer.

Fairbanks



Alaska's second-largest city – Hub of the Interior, Gateway to the Bush, the Golden Heart City – call it what you will, Fairbanks is as diverse and distinct as any place in Alaska.

Monday, Day 11

Riverboat Discovery

Board the Sternwheeler Riverboat Discovery that will take you into the heart of Alaska and a family who has made the river their way of life for five generations. Be immersed in frontier living first hand with a guided walking tour of an Athabascan Indian village. It's an Indian village with cabins made of spruce logs, a cache used for storing supplies, a primitive spruce bark hut and fur pelts. The guides will explain how the wolf, fox, martin and beaver were used to provide food and protection in the harsh Arctic climate. They will also share how the Athabascans skillfully survived for over 10,000 years and how they adapted to village life and Western culture in the past century. At the end of your guided tour, you will have time to explore the village on your own, interact with the guides and visit dogs from Iditarod winner Susan Butcher's kennels.

DENALI



The towering granite spires and snowy summits of Denali National Park and Preserve straddles 160 miles of the Alaska Range and display so much elevation they are often lost in the clouds. Dominating this skyline is North America's highest peak; Mount McKinley standing tall at 20,237 feet and one of the most amazing sights in Alaska.

Check in: 02:30 p.m.

Check out: Thursday

Your accommodations are located seven miles south of the park entrance and nestled along the banks of the Nenana River. Spread over 20 acres it offers light hiking and interpretive trails throughout the facility. For the adventurous, there are more rugged trails located near the property entrance. Ideal for families and convenient for travelers with their own vehicle, this Denali Lodge brings you close to the action – yet enjoy the evening solitude as you relax to the sound of the river sweeping by.

Wednesday, Day 13

Kantishna Wilderness Trails

Departure time: 07:00 a.m.

Return time: 05:00 p.m.

Fully narrated, all-day trip. Not only do you get to travel the entire road—which gives you more opportunities to spot wildlife—but you'll also have planned stops to get out, stretch your legs and explore a bit at points along the way, including Kantishna, an area deep in the park with a gold-mining past, and one that most Denali visitors never see.

You'll spend a couple hours at the Kantishna Roadhouse, a lodge originally built in the early 1900s that once accommodated a rush of hopeful gold miners seeking their fortunes. (Since then it has served as a private residence, community center, a post office and inn.) You'll have an excellent soup-and-sandwich lunch, followed by the options of watching a dog-mushing demonstration or a little informal gold-panning. Or, you can take a short walk along the creek, or just sit in a rocker at the lodge and soak up the scenery



Thursday, Day 14

Denali To Anchorage

Departure: 07:45 a.m.


Arrival: 01:30 p.m.
